

There is, however, a new pioneer that has started in a neighbouring parish that is looking to use this model in her local primary school, so I'm feeling very blessed by those that see my work and do likewise.

Greenfinch Youth Community

The youth group is still going well. We have still got 30 young people attending this and a growing waiting list. There are some young people that have left but a new group of young people have taken their spot from the waiting list, which is still seeing numbers been added to it. The demand for more youth groups is paramount. We are still the most significant youth facility in the area.

Over the summer term we decided to do something that would help us



So, we opened a drop in café, serving hot and cold drinks and freshly baked goods from the church community.

This was received well by the parents, and we found that we were full every week with parents, our young people and their young and sometimes older brothers and sisters. It was such a blessing to spend so much time with them all together and also offered us the opportunity to ask questions about what they think and feel about their community.



Since coming back in September, our young people have changed quite significantly. The young people are experiencing loss of friendship, due to changing friendship groups - young people are in different classes and have had to develop new relationships to cope with the new situation they face. Some of our young people go to a different school and feel alienated by their old friendships when they come to our group, and the workload and demand from schoolwork and homework means that our young people are feeling more pressured than ever which is coming out in aggressive behaviour, tears and a general high level of boisterousness we haven't experienced before in these young people.

At the end of the year, we felt that the youth group were a community together. We have to recognise now that, due to the pressures and changes that come with secondary school, we are more fragmented. We're not starting from scratch, but we are starting further back from a different angle, from a different foundation.

The good news is that we are in communication with parents and working together for the sake of these very precious young people.

Youth Community Network - Lightwave.community

Since the beginning of Summer, we have been acutely aware that our youth community is full and the need to expand has been a very pressing concern for us. The questions that have challenged us are:

- 1. How do we create more spaces for young people so that we can invite more young people into this great community?
- 2. How do we encourage other churches to do a similar thing in their own churches?
- 3. How do we grow and envision adult and young leaders so that these youth spaces can run safely?

It then occurred to me that we could offer churches a package. I can bring training resources and even invite young people to their church, if they would allow me to use their building and recruit volunteers through their church.

So, I approached another Church in the area and suggested that we work together to create another youth space that would act as a second building that young people can choose to go to on the night that is best suited to them and their friends.

This increases our young people reach by another 30 young people therefore meeting the needs of 60 young people across the area every Friday evening if the church agreed.

Thankfully, the Church agreed and so we are in the process of DBS checking, interviewing and training a new team of volunteers using the mycn.org.uk resource I mentioned in my last newsletter. Have a look at this as it is the pioneer youth resource adopted by much of the youth work done within Church Army.

Hopefully, by early next year, we will have a new team and a new youth expression learning the values and ethos of the Christ community.

I'm really excited by all that is happening in this work, and it is so good to see the Spirit moving in so many areas of the youth community at large. I personally feel so blessed to be counted as amongst those who are bearing witness to God's moving in Ipswich and beyond.

6th Form College

You may remember that I was working with the 6th form college last year; running lunch clubs and taking young people on residential weekends led by the diocesan youth officer at Sizewell Hall. This work drew a conclusion shortly after the trip to Sizewell Hall as the college changed the structure of education leaving it very difficult for me to work in the way that I had done previously. After much conversation it seemed right to step back from this work and pursue work in the other 6th form college in town. This


has a very well-established chaplaincy presence already which means I can get involved in what's already happening there and hopefully find meaningful ways of contributing to this team, more on this when I start - probably in the new year.

I still see some of the young people from the college as they are Becky's age (daughter) but unfortunately, I no longer work with them in the way I used to.

Conclusion

My work in Chantry is building up. We are coming up to our first year with the youth group on Friday nights. We are beginning to see more opportunities to listen, love & serve and build community with the young people there.

I am very much a part of the school now too with a growing trust and responsibilities to care for the young people across all year groups.



I am beginning to share the methodology of my work more broadly too with other churches in the area who are seeking to reach out in similar ways using mentoring and coaching practices from the mycn.org.uk resources.

Thank you for taking the time to read, pray and financially support the work of Church Army. I feel so blessed to know you are all behind us as a family and also me personally as I seek to bring Christ into the midst of this budding new community.
